

THE JOURNEY TO SAVE TEUCHEEN WOOD



TEUCHEEN WOOD AT RISK

May 2019 - Contact from residents concerned about Teucheen Wood being proposed for sale on the open market - putting it at considerable risk.



Fear of losing our much-loved woodland coupled with annoyance over the lack of consultation brought our village community together and urged us to act.

It took 3 weeks to find the contact person who would halt the land auction and speak to our community about a possible **private land sale**.



FUNDING, FEASIBILITY & PLANNING

After officially establishing IDT as a community not-for-profit organisation in April 2020, we received amazing support from DTAS, the Scottish Land Fund, Community Land Scotland, Community Woodland Association and our local Councillor lain Nicolson, to help with consultation, funding, feasibility and planning.



Our Community Council was tasked with figuring out the buying process - Renfrewshire Council directed us to lain at Engage Renfrewshire, who sent us to Isla at Development Trust Association Scotland, and then passed us on to Tony at Highlands & Islands Enterprise for the Scotlish Land Fund.

We phoned here, there, and everywhere, and within a few months we had started paperwork to create Inchinnan Development Trust - a business with the right structure to buy land.



5 COMMUNITY BUY-OUT

In December 2021, Inchinnan Development Trust was successful in the purchase of Teucheen Wood for community ownership - ensuring its on-going preservation and protection for generations to come!

The final step in our buying process? A village party to celebrate our success and to thank the community for its support and all those who helped us along the way!

With Teucheen Wood now in safe hands, IDT can focus on its management and preservation - and we have now set our sights on other at-risk greenspaces and woodlands within our community!

If you go down to the woods ... watch out for the mystery 'tree killer'

First there was a chainsaw attack at Teucheen Wood near Erskine, Renfrewshire, and now four trees appear to have been poisoned — police are investigating

Twisted sycamore trees reach towards the sky offering shelter to bats and foxes in Teucheen Wood, a centuries-old woodland on the outskirts of Erskine in Renfrewshire, beloved by the community as a tranquil haven for walks and woodland crafts.

Now, though, the six-acre site, which is surrounded by Inchinnan village on one side and a new housing development on the other, is plagued by a mysterious serial tree killer. "It's like a homemade murder plot," Maggie Morrison, the development officer for Inchinnan Development Trust, which owns the woodland, said.
